appointed by Act of Parliament for enquiring into the Losses and Services of the American Loyalists. —

The humble Petition of Elijah Benedict late of Woodbury Connecticut humbly Sheweth,

Whereas at the commencement of the late War between Great Britain and America your Petitioner was possessed of a small Fortune which he had acquired by his own Industry and had for a number of years previous to the commencement of the said War lived in affluence but in consequence of his Loyalty to the British Government he in the year 1777 left his Station consisting of a good Farm, well furnished with Stock and in a fine Situation and joined the British Forces at Skeneboro, under the protection of which he remained until the close of the War, at which time he returned to Pawlet and has been endeavoring to recover his said Farm and so forth, but to his great Misfortune his said Farm together

with the whole of his Estate Real & Personal was confiscated to and for the use of the State of Vermont by virtue of a certain Law in that case made and provided by the Legislative Authority of the said State by which confiscation your Petitioner was reduced to almost a state of Beggary and has been obliged to labour by the day for his Bread - And your humble Petitioner humbly prays that your Honours will consider the distressed Situation of your humble Petitioner and grant him such Relief as your Honours will think proper. - Your Petitioner is fully persuaded that Gentlemen of your Honours Humanity will grant your Petitioner a compensation for his said Losses. -
