DR. SUSAN BENEDICT OF SMITH IS DEAD

Mathematics Professor From 1921 Until Retirement on Feb. 1 Stricken at 69

JOINED FACULTY IN 1906

Alumna of College Was Class Dean, 1918-26—Won Degrees at Columbia and Michigan

NORTHAMPTON, Mass., April 9 (A)—Miss Susan Benedict, a member of the Smith College faculty for thirty-six years, died last night of a heart attack at the age of 69.

Miss Benedict was born in Norwalk, Ohio, and was graduated from Smith in 1895, receiving her M. A. degree from Columbia and her Ph. D. from the University of Michigan.

Dr. Benedict was a daughter of David Benedict and Mrs. Harriett Dever Benedict. As a Smith College undergraduate she was elected to Phi Beta Kappa. She received her M. A. degree from Columbia in 1906 and her Ph. D. from Michigan in 1914.

She joined the Smith faculty in 1906, became a full Professor of Mathematics in 1921 and professor emeritus on her retirement on Feb. 1. In 1918-26 Dr. Benedict was a class dean at Smith.

She leaves two sisters, Mrs. M. L. W. Wickham of Fort Lauderdale, Fla., and Mrs. W. H. Benham of Norwalk. A funeral service will be held at 2:30 P. M. today in Northampton. Burial will be in Norwalk.
